Young Carers Have-a-Go



Young Carers Have-a-Go

There seems to be an increasing interest in archery, which is encouraging. A couple of weeks ago we received a contact on our website asking if we could arrange a taster session for a group of young carers. The only problem was that it was very short notice, as they wanted to come along on Thursday 28th October 2021.

Clearly, we cannot run such sessions without the assistance of several FoBB members, who are willing to share their experience in showing people how to shoot at a Have-a-Go. This, of course, is different to a beginners course and is only giving people the opportunity to try it out and have a bit of fun. Naturally we always hope that participants would then sign up for a course and become members, but it also helps to promote archery to a wider audience and it helps the club's funds.

Having asked for volunteers, I was very pleased that several members came forward to help out at such short notice. Many thanks to our members who came along to show the young carers how to shoot; Brian & Josie Chandler, Nigel & Jennifer Cam, Shaun & Taran Welsh, Dave Revell and Sandra Rasewska, without whom we would not be able to offer this experience to a worthwhile cause.

I met with The Kings Arms carers group co-ordinator at the field the week before the event and discussed all the details, including safety information and clothing; as well as how we would run the session, length of time and so on. It was suggested that there would be 3 adults and 9 young carers coming to our field to try their hand at archery. So, on the day, I met our members at the field about an hour and a half before the carers were due to arrive, and we set about preparing the targets and other equipment that was required (as you can see from the photos).

On arrival, I explained how the session was to be run and went through all the safety instructions that were to be followed. I then introduced our members who were going to act as target captains and ensure that the safety aspects were obeyed. After that all the participants were measured up for bows and arrows to be allocated. When all was ready, Brian gave a quick demonstration about what to do and we then started the session in earnest.







As you will see from the photographs, we began with some jigsaw puzzle faces, to get everyone's eye in. After a few ends of that, we got out the balloons and they all got very excited when balloons started popping. However, there was also a bit of frustration when the balloons were missed, still everyone kept trying and had a great time. We also did a bit of simple scoring and these were read out at the end.

The session ended after nearly two hours, as the carers had to move on to get their lunch, although they still wanted to carry on for a bit longer. The carers gave our members a big round of applause. for all their help in making the session such a success. Before leaving, their co-ordinator thanked us for a wonderful session and particularly for all the care that was taken with all the safety issues.

All in all it was a very good session and a worthwhile thing to do, so my thanks again to all our members that came to help.

Brian's Tips



Some words of advice for Recurve Archers

I was asked why you have to adjust your windage when changing distances. There are too many reasons to cover here to be a complete answer i.e. centre shot, button pressure and arrow spec, but the biggest culprit is your string picture. This is where you set your string in relation to your sight/riser.



I admit it is sometimes hard to see your string as it can be a blur but practicing getting the blur in between the inside of your riser and your sight pin seems to work for most archers (D in the picture) the importance of this is to keep your string inline with your arrow/ sight pin because if you don't do this the chances are you are releasing your string at an angle to the arrow therefore send the arrow off at an angle.

I hope this is of use as it is easily overlooked even by archers who have been shooting for a long time.
